School Highlights:

- o COVID 19: 3 positive cases 2 staff and 1 student as per dashboard
- We are working closely with OPH we get our direction from them and the board.
 Communications and follow-ups are provided by OPH
- Deep cleansing has been taken care of and they're reviewing all protocols
- o Staff shortages are happening. Receiving help with casual/central staff
- Planning for the 2021/2022 school year is underway. A bit later than last year with projections; projections and enrolments directly impact staffing

- Question from Cheryl: Will VM receive funding next year for smaller class sizes, similar to what we rec'd this year? No, we aren't guaranteed the extra funding.
- Comment from Allison: With 3 cases so far, knowing that the virus is in the school, some parents wish they would return to virtual schooling for a few weeks to avoid further cases/spread. Ginette shared that she has heard both sides of this argument, the other side being that schools should remain open through these cases.
- Question from Donna: Was there any feedback from the community screening held at the St Patrick's gym? OPH didn't give specific #s but were no positive cases identified from our school.
- Questions from Cheryl: what about the massive puddles outside? Scott is looking into this quite a bit to ensure all students have outdoor space despite puddles.
- Question from Heather: What about having some kids in the front year? It's a possibility, maybe older kids?
- Question from Amanda: Is there anything parents can do to help? Parents who want to help could shovel snow onto pavement for it to melt

5) Fundraising

 Do Nothing: Allison has the poster updated and will work with office staff to set up School Cash Online. Motion for the dates of the fundraiser to be March 22-28 date was carried (Kerri Rodier, Chrystal Beckett).

6) Treasurer's Report

- The figure we have to spend this year is \$2,074.17.
- We've already transferred \$2000 for wish lists, \$1800 for kinder yard

7) Kinder Project

- 4 new trees approved by City of Ottawa and OCDSB for May 2021 planting
- \$400 of gardening tools (shovels, rakes, watering cans etc.) have arrived at VM and Home
 Hardware Elmvale provided a 25% discount

- Ritchies provided estimate of \$597 for plant materials we will order from them as the other vendors have not responded and Ritchies has offered 25% discount. Will finalize the list and submit for Board approval ASAP.
- O Jeff Kaster from Evergreen said the mud kitchen can be installed next to the shed in the kinder yard in summer and will not require a new accessible path. This frees up the additional \$1000 council funding approved for our project. We will need to remove a small bench attached to that side of the shed prior to installation. Meeting with Mr. Macklin March 18 to discuss form 800 that Mr. Fields will fill out to order this and the tree protection.

- O Garden clean-up scheduled for April 24 and 25
- Kinder yard planting scheduled for May 22 and 23
